

Amplified calls for systemic reform in instances of Indigenous death in healthcare institutions, and community education and action in the face of growing reports of mass graves across Turtle Island's sites of colonial residential schools and former churches.

Offered virtual support to members of the Two-Spirit and Queer community through the Trans ID Clinic initiative, online Positive Space training in partnership with the YÉN:TENE project and ongoing expansion of community resources and support.
